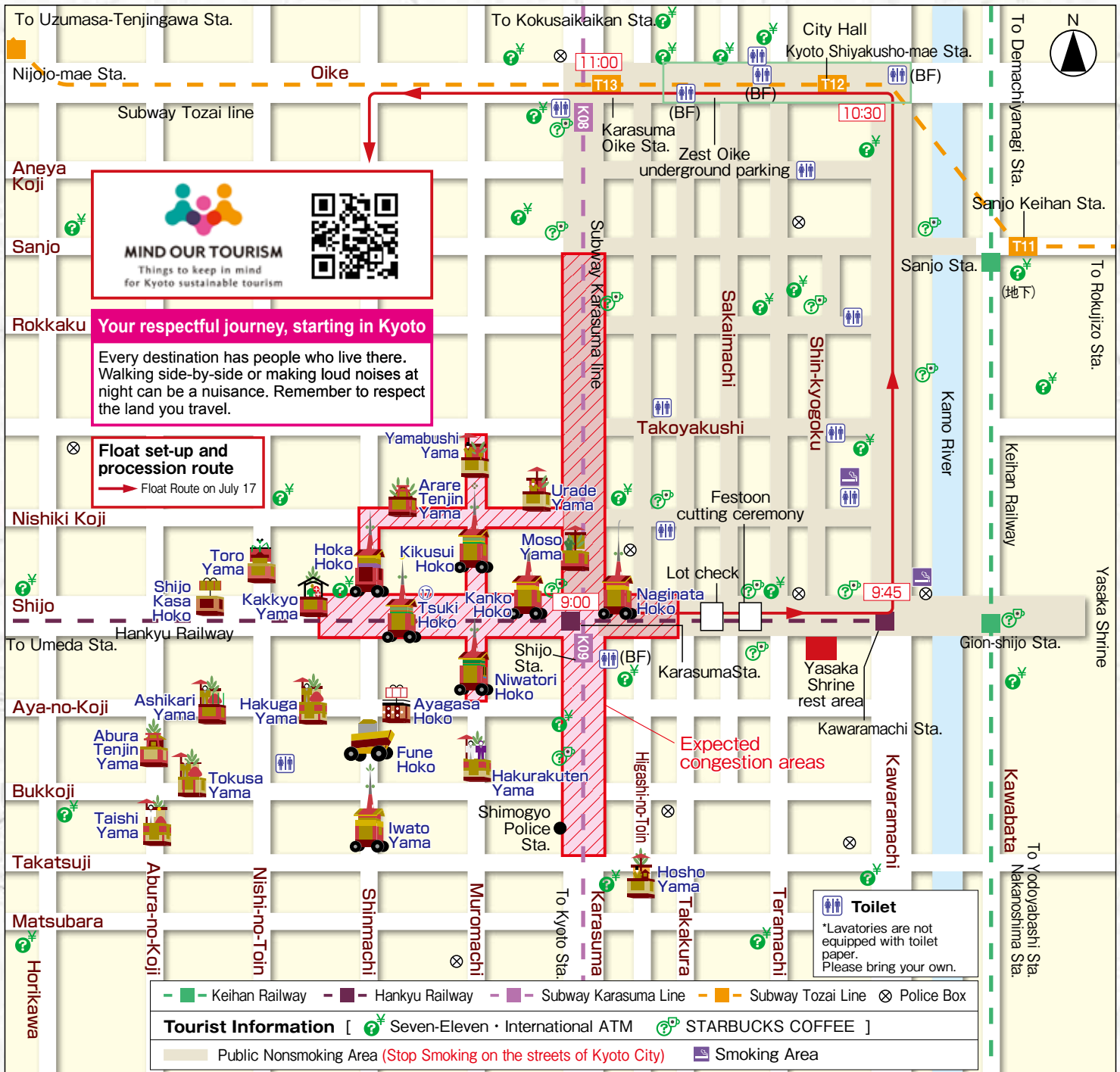

On Yoi-yoi-yoi-yama (July 14) and from July 21 to 23, the three days prior to "Ato-matsuri" (the latter festival),

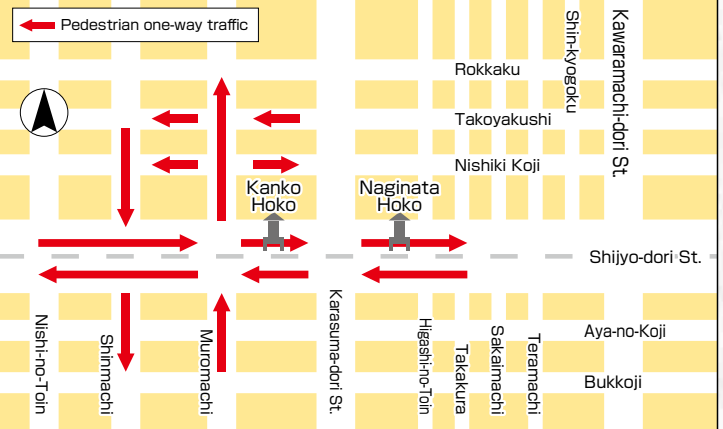
- vehicle-free areas are **NOT** placed on Shijo-dori Street and Karasuma-dori Street, and
- stalls are **NOT** set up.

On July 15 and 16 only, vehicle-free areas are implemented from 18:00 until around 23:00 on Shijo-dori Street and Karasuma-dori Street. During this time period, you are not allowed to enter/exit vehicles at parking lots in the controlled areas. Anticipate enough time to enter/exit vehicles.

During the pedestrianized time,
PEDESTRIANS MUST PROCEED ON THE LEFT SIDE OF SHIJO-DORI STREET.



Flow of pedestrians when vehicle-free areas are arranged



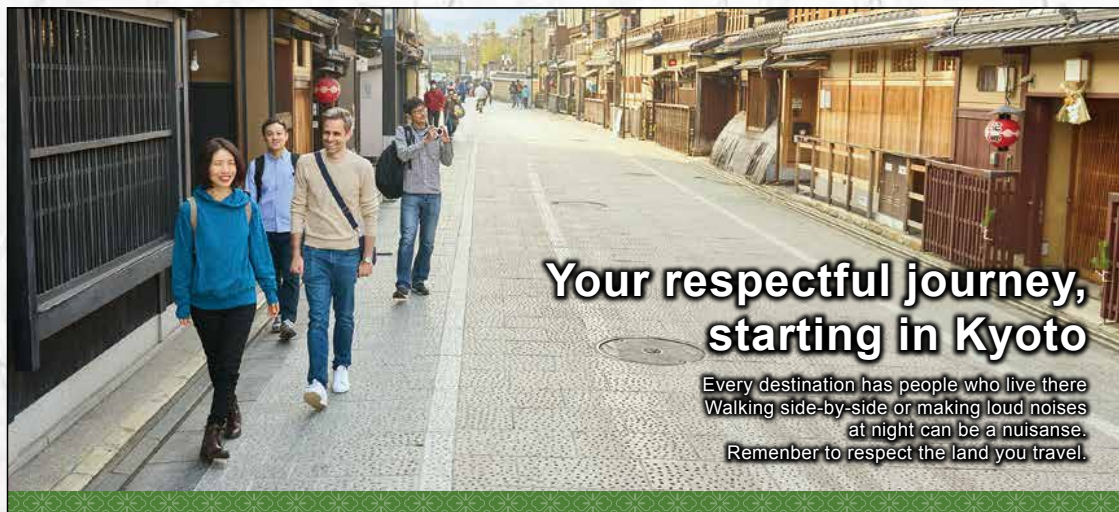
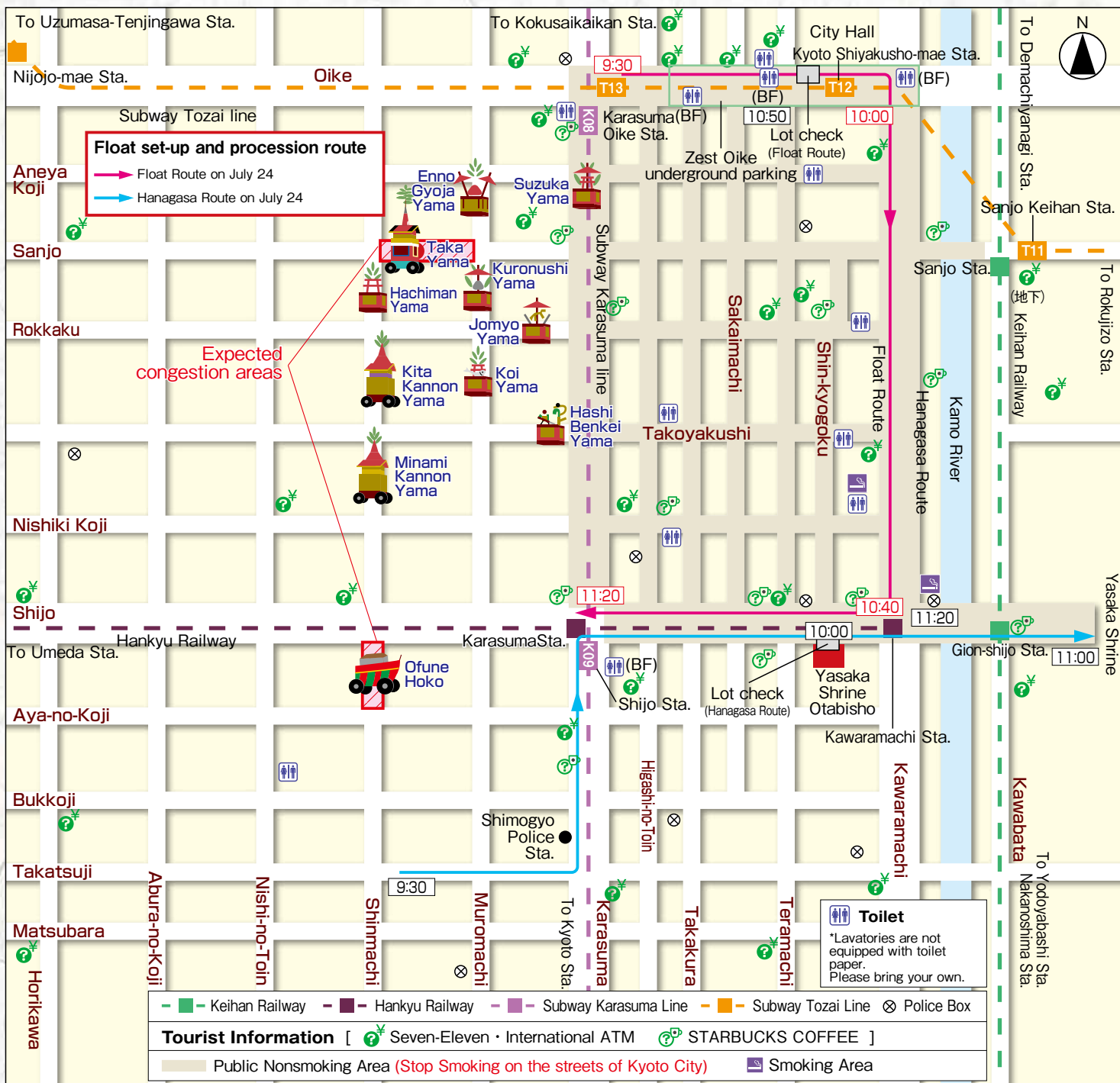
