

The Kyoto Guidelines for Sustainable Tourism

The Kyoto Guidelines for Sustainable Tourism are guidelines for tourists, tourism operators, residents, governments, tourist associations, and everyone else involved in tourism in Kyoto to respect one another and work together to create sustainable tourism in Kyoto.



MIND YOUR MANNERS WHEN IN KYOTO...

- Shhh... Be considerate. Move quietly. Avoid shouting or laughing in residential areas or religious sites.
- Don't follow the crowd. Leave your luggage behind. Hand Free KYOTO!
- Don't litter. Don't block the road. No smoking on public streets.
- Acta marked with a prohibition sign (🚫) may violate Japanese law. Depending on the situation, police may intervene.

Travel Smart

Start your comfortable travel from Kyoto

Avoid the crowds by checking on congestion at your destination and by using the trains.

Board any Kyoto Municipal Subway line, all routes on the Kyoto City Bus, Kyoto Buses "Westerly", and West Japan JR Buses in most cases within one hour-one day.
Most major tourist destinations in Kyoto can be visited using these buses. (Excludes some routes)
Using the subway and bus in combination can reduce travel times to make getting around Kyoto more efficient, for travel that is cost-effective and convenient.

Kyoto Bus and West Japan JR Bus cannot be used with the Kyoto One-Day Pass. (Kyoto One-Day Pass does not include the Kinkaku Bus or West Japan JR Bus with those routes.)



Enjoy hands-free sightseeing in Kyoto

Bringing suitcases or other large luggage onto buses or trains can cause crowding and even prevent local residents from using their own transportation systems. Go "hands-free sightseeing" whenever possible so everyone can get around comfortably!

The degree of congestion

Enjoy safe and secure travel in Kyoto. We provide useful information for avoiding congestion, by forecasting comfort levels around popular spots, real-time information from live cameras, and attractive sightseeing spots that are relatively empty during the day.

Please enjoy sightseeing in Kyoto comfortably while still fully avoiding crowded times and places.

*The degree of congestion is the number of people at a sightseeing spot indicated on a 5-point scale.



