A culture at risk

- Kyotos traditional industries are under threat from lower demand and a decreasing number of young artisans.
- Nishijin weaving and Kyo-Yuzen dyeing (used in the making of kimonos) have seen a 95% drop since their peak.
- This threatens Kyoto and Japan's cultural identity.





A cityscape at risk

- Due to preservation costs and other factors, 800 Kyo-Machiya are lost every year.
- Without action, they will disappear within 50 years.
