#### traditional Yuzen Dying experience

Discover the traditional art of Kyoto Yuzen dyeing in the heart of the Nishijin district. Visit a traditional machiya townhouse and learn about the history of the area from your guide. Meet your guide at the Nishijin district and head to the workshop of a local Kyoto Yuzen artist. Learn about the history of the area and the art of Kyoto Yuzen dyeing. Admire the intricate designs of the Kyoto Yuzen technique, which uses silk fabric and vibrant colors to create beautiful patterns. Try your hand at the art of Kyoto Yuzen dyeing and create your own piece of art to take home.







#### **Kyo-Yuzen Artisan**

#### Experience Traditional Crafts: Enjoy the Gold-Leaf Art of Kyo-Yuzen

Kyo-Yuzen gold decoration is a special decorative technique that forms part of Kyoto's traditional textile art, Kyo-Yuzen. It involves using gold leaf, gold powder, and other materials to lavishly embellish kimono, adding elegance and brilliance. In this workshop, participants can try their hand at tsutsugaki, one of the gold decoration techniques, to create their own unique original piece.

In the gold decoration technique, tsutsugaki is a traditional resist-dyeing method in which a cone-shaped applicator filled with paste is used to draw patterns freely, without an underlying sketch. In Kyo-Yuzen gold decoration, this tsutsugaki is combined with the application of gold leaf, gold powder, or metallic foil to add sparkle and depth. The patterns, blending the precision of hand-drawn lines with the brilliance of gold, embody both the artisan's high level of skill and a timeless beauty that continues to be cherished.











A workshop in Kyoto that has been producing hand-painted Kyo-Yuzen with gold embellishments for over 100 years. The techniques have been passed down through four generations, with the second generation's Iseo Tanaka receiving the Order of the Sacred Treasure. Both the second and third generations have been recognized as traditional craftsmen in the hand-painted Kyo-Yuzen category by the Minister of Economy, Trade, and Industry, and have been selected as "Masters of Kyoto," distinguished artisans of Kyoto Prefecture's traditional industries.





#### Pottery painting experience

Japanese pottery painting is a traditional craft that has cherished the harmony of practicality and beauty, and has been loved by people for centuries. In a one to one and a half hour experience, you can immerse yourself in the world of Kyoto ceramics and learn the techniques passed down by skilled craftsmen. You will have the opportunity to experience the techniques that have adorned Japanese pottery, such as the rhythm of brush strokes and the use of vibrant mineral pigments.

Participants can choose their favorite item from a wide selection of pottery, such as matcha bowls, plates, or decorative pieces, and decorate it with a design inspired by seasonal motifs or their own personal image. Creating in a space surrounded by shelves filled with finely crafted pieces is, in itself, a special memory. After painting, the work will be glazed and fired, and by the following day, participants can take it home as a functional piece that brings back memories of their time in Kyoto. The warm and inviting shop interior is lined with shelves full of vessels that combine functional beauty and artistic expression, embodying the essence of Kyoto's ceramic culture.





















#### Traditional Candle Painting Workshop

Learn to paint your own Kyoto-style candle with natural pigments at a traditional workshop. Discover the history and cultural significance of Kyo-rousoku candles.

Discover Kyoto's rich candle-making heritage at Nakamura Rousoku, one of the last remaining makers of Kyo-rousoku (Wa-rousoku)—traditional Japanese candles made from natural plant wax and washi paper. In this hands-on workshop, you'll paint your own candle using vibrant pigments and fine brushes, guided by artisans who preserve generations of craftsmanship. These candles, known for their tall, steady flame and sustainable materials, are deeply tied to Japanese rituals and seasonal traditions.

Begin with a short introduction to the history and cultural meaning of Wa-rousoku, then enjoy a peaceful painting session where your creativity takes shape. No experience is necessary, and all materials are included. Set in a quiet, historical Kyoto neighborhood, this workshop offers a calming and meaningful way to connect with Japan's traditional arts—and create a beautiful keepsake to take home.

The "Kyomaru Uchiwa" that makes a name for itself

The personalized "Kyomaru Uchiwa," gifted by the maiko and geiko of Kyoto's five hanamachi during summer, is a representative work of Komaruya Sumii. With a crest on one side and a name dyed in red on the other, it has received high acclaim overseas, including at Japan House in the UK. We will inquire about your name in advance to create a personalized uchiwa and present it to you on the day. We will explain the history of Komaruya, offer a workshop tour (requires arrangement), and guide you to the Traditional Industry Museum.

Daio-in Temple, a pagoda of Myoshin-ji Temple, the head temple of the Rinzai sect of Buddhism, was built in 1603 by Mitsutada Ishikawa, a retainer of the Owari Tokugawa family, to commemorate the memory of his father Mitsumoto.

The temple gate, Kori and Hojo are designated as cultural properties by Kyoto Prefecture, and the 72 sliding doors in the Hojo were made by Shibata Zeshin, a famous lacquer craftsman and artist of the Edo period.

By the end of the workshop, you'll have created your own unique piece of calligraphy to take home, a lasting reminder of your time spent in the peaceful surroundings of Yotokuin Sub-Temple. Whether you're a beginner or have prior experience, this workshop offers a unique opportunity to immerse yourself in Japanese culture and art.

#### Zen Morning Porridge and Meditation Experience

Enjoy a morning porridge and talk about Zen with the vice-abbot of Yotokuin, the pagoda of Myochuji Temple. Experience Zen meditation and calm your mind.

Have a meal of morning porridge with the Deputy Chief Priest of Yotokuin, Myoshin-ji Temple, and enjoy the experience of Zen (zazen). Listen to a Dharma talk and get tips on how to apply Zen thinking to your daily life. Meet the vice-abbot of Yotokuin, the pagoda of Myoshinji Temple, and enjoy morning porridge. Experience Zen meditation and calm your mind. Listen to a Dharma talk and get tips on how to apply Zen thinking to your daily life. Exchange opinions with fellow participants. Enjoy a morning gruel to introduce and sublimate Zen ideas into your daily lives and enrich your days. Afterwards, be guided in zazen and encouraged to use your naves. Dharma talks provide an opportunity to think deeply about the Zen way of thinking and living. The aim of this program is to develop the ability to look at things from a bird's eye view and to discard stereotypes by practicing Zen. Participants will be able to digest the teachings in their own way in order to find meaning in their own lives.

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
#### Yamashina Farm Tour with Breakfast

1. around Shijo Kawaramachi

2. Hanamikoji, Gion

Characteristics: An area full of emotion, lined with traditional machiya townhouses. A wealth of traditional Kyoto cultural items, including kimonos, Kyoto sweets, crafts and an antique gallery open by appointment only.

Places to visit: handmade crafts, traditional Kyoto sweets shops and a shop where you can try renting kimono.

3. Okazaki

Museum of Traditional Crafts Museum and other museums where you can find all the traditional crafts of Kyoto, with detailed explanations to show you the goodness of the crafts.
